

8.3 Homework Tip

It is very difficult to keep your grammaticality judgments from getting biased by the hypothesis you are working with, which means it's easy to end up with unreliable data. For this reason, it is often useful to ask other people (who are not currently thinking about the same hypothesis) for their grammaticality judgments as well.
